# After the Bus Stop Bombing: An ENP Volunteer's Determination to Make a Difference



Many junior year abroad students must confront their friends' and families' concerns about studying in the midst of terrorism and conflict when they choose to study in Israel. One ENP volunteer's personal encounter of the bombing spurred the visiting student to share her story of fulfillment in the face of terror.

When I decided to study abroad here in Jerusalem, many of my friends and family members back home could not comprehend my decision. For the three months before I left, I had people tell me time and time again that the Middle East was dangerous and that they were concerned for my safety. These claims, however, did not faze me, as I knew that traveling to and living in Israel was something that I wanted to do. I appreciated their concern, but I did not actually take their words to heart.

About two months into my stay here in Israel, there was a terrorist attack in Jerusalem near the central bus station. Knowing that the attack occurred so close to me, at a place that I visit quite frequently was frightening enough, and learning that the woman who was murdered in the attack was my classmate almost pushed me over the edge.
