## Prime Minister Netanyahu to Attend ENP Five Year Celebration

"The Government of Israel has been a partner of ENP since it was first envisioned," explains Mengesha. "The Government's participation and support is tremendous and expressed in many ways, including financial. In fact, the Government's fiscal participation has remained steady and even grown from year to year, during a time of budget cuts in Israel and shrinking funds from North American Jewry."

"Full and successful integration of the Ethiopian-Israeli community can be achieved," adds Mengesha, who this week was bestowed with the prestigious Samuel Rothberg Prize for Jewish Education by the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. "But success requires increased investment."

Mengesha concludes: "ENP is the shared responsibility of Jews of the Diaspora and the Government of Israel. Together we must, and can, effectively address this issue."

Additional guests of honor at the ENP Event include Minister of Education Mr. Gideon Sa'ar, Minister of Immigrant Absorption MK Sofa Landver and Minister of Social Affairs and Services MK Isaac Herzog. Natan Sharansky, Chairman of the Executive of JAFI, members of the Jewish Agency for Israel Board of Governors, Federation representatives and other leaders will also be in attendance. The festive event will be held in Jerusalem.
