Ethiopian National Project (ENP) E-News

Dear Friend,

Today, May 12, 2010 (28 Iyar, 5770), we commemorate the Memorial Day for the 4,000 Ethiopian Jews who perished in the mid-80s on the way to Sudan or in refugee camps in Sudan while waiting to make aliyah. Of the approximately 12,000 Ethiopian Jews who set out on foot across mountains and deserts from Ethiopia to Sudan, only 8,000 survived the journey.

It is no coincidence that this Memorial Day falls on Jerusalem Day (Yom Yerushalayim). Throughout their history, Ethiopian Jews have longed to return to Jerusalem, and this desire has been an integral part of their identity.

However, the miraculous return of the community to Israel was just the beginning. The Ethiopian National Project's task is to secure the future of the Ethiopian-Israeli community in Israel, focusing on the most pressing social and educational needs of Ethiopian Israeli youth. Memorial Day is therefore an opportune time to reflect on how far we've come and the challenges that still await us on the road ahead. With your support, we can transform our vision of the Ethiopian-Israeli community into a reality.

Did You Know? ENP, Self Confidence and Self Esteem

Did you know that ENP's Scholastic Assistance Program and Youth Outreach Centers are proven to build self confidence and increase self esteem among Ethiopian-Israeli youth? ENP Scholastic Assistance provides supplementary hours of educational support to students in small groups, addressing the social and personal barriers to success that they face. ENP Youth Centers provide educational, social, personal development and leadership development workshops for teens.

- 70-80% of the participants in ENP's Scholastic Assistance Program reported an increase in their self image, interpersonal relations and perseverance (Branco Weiss Institute, September 2009).
- A Myers-JDC-Brookdale evaluation of ENP Youth Centers (2008) reports an increase from 56% to 75% of ENP Youth
 Center participants who are prepared to raise hands and answer questions in class, a likely indication of increased self
 confidence as an outcome of their involvement in ENP's Youth Centers.
