SPACE Is Back at School



With the success of Israel's vaccination campaign and easing of COVID-19 restrictions, schools across Israel have recently resumed in-person learning for all age groups. Currently, 11th and 12th graders are permitted to be vaccinated, and it is anticipated that youth aged 12-16 will be soon be eligible as well. ENP has been closely adhering to Government of Israel health regulations since the pandemic began, and in line with the latest directives is now enabling in-person instruction as part of the SPACE (School Performance and Community Empowerment) program. For the remainder of the year, SPACE group instruction and extra-curricular activities will assume a hybrid capacity, combining both in-person

and Zoom meetings to best serve participants' needs.

While the Ministry of Education is advancing the possibility of extending the school year through July, ENP is working on various summer plans for SPACE participants, including an overnight 3-day seminar combining instruction, workshops and social activities.

ENP is thrilled to announce a new program and partnership launched this month! One of ENP's core objectives is the empowerment of the Ethiopian-Israeli community as a means to advance full integration into Israeli society. As such, and with the support of the German Federal Foreign Office's funds by ifa (Institut für Auslandsbeziehungen), funding Programme zivik, ENP has crafted the ENP Municipal Leadership and Community Advocacy Training Program for Ethiopian-Israelis. The program aims to increase representation of Ethiopian-Israelis in



municipal councils and state parliament and to encourage the community's political participation as part of local decision-making bodies.

The program trains and empowers members of the Ethiopian-Israeli community who wish to become politically involved and serve as advocates for the community in municipal and state bodies, in a series of 10 workshops and through practical application in the form of a group project. Leading the program on behalf of ENP is <u>Orit Taya</u>, an Ethiopia-born social activist dedicated to making a difference and empowering the Ethiopian-Israeli community.
